Rite of Revival is a multimedia interactive performance inspired by the history of torture, pain and deformation. The performance is constructed as a collective ritual where the solo performer plays the role of an offering projecting a choreography of the dismantled body. The spectators participate in the ritual which takes a circular shape. They move from witnessing to participating in the shaping of the performative act, and in transforming the collective memory. Their spectatorship is rooted in the ancient collective practices of the rituals of transformation. With Rite of Revival the spectatorship is also performative and politically active. It is an experience of re-visiting and re-enacting the painful past, an experiment in performing trauma, and finding a togetherness that transcends the victimization, and functions as a healing medium through the collective bonding of the community of spectators. It is the same bonding that flourished during the Egyptian revolution of 25 January 2011.

Nora Amin is the Valeska-Gert guest professor at FU Berlin for the summer semester of 2018, her topic is »Performing Trauma«. Her most important projects in Egypt were »The Egyptian National Project for Theatre of the Oppressed« (the first organized movement of theatre for change on a national scale), the first Arabic book on theatre and human rights »The Art if Claming our Right«, and a multidisciplinary ongoing project on the violations of the female body in public sphere (including *Migrating the Feminine* (»Weiblichkeit im Aufbruch«).
